## Worsted weight

50 grams $100 \%$ cotton yarn and a $5.00 \mathrm{~mm} / \mathrm{H}$ hook

## DK/8ply

50 grams $100 \%$ cotton yarn and a $3.5 \mathrm{~mm} / \mathrm{F}$ hook
Scissors
Yarn needle
NOTE: Easy to adjust the size by making more or less chains - the length of the chain is the approx. width of the project

1. Ch 25 hdc into the $2 n d$ ch form hook, hdc into each ch across, 3 hdc into last ch hdc into each stitch, working down the other side of the chain work 1 hdc in each ch across, 2 hdc into the last chain DO NOT JOIN ROUND
2. Hdc into every stitch - work into the back back loop of the hdc (see video tutorial for explanation of the back back loop) https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=rIn4keTYXt4
3. Repeat round 3 for remainder of project (approx. 11 rounds) - Continue until when you folded it the edges meet (see $2^{\text {nd }}$ last photo) finish round off half way through a round so that the yarn finishes in the correct place when folded (see last photo)
Turn sideways so you are looking at the end -see below


Fold edge down - see next 2 images


You have enough rounds when the edges meet

Finish off round half way


## Hanging loop

Ch 10, slip stitch to the first chain to make a loop, 15 hdc into ch 10 loops (you can also use a sc if you prefer) join to the first stitch with a slip stitch, finish off leaving approx. 8 inches of yarn

Fold dish cloth, sew up seam, making sure you close the gap near the hanging loop, sew into the loops closest to the seam - see video for further information https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=rln4keTYXt4 Finish off and sew in ends
