

DIMPLE HAT

Materials

Adult (less for a smaller size) 1 1/2 oz/100gms of each colour of Worsted weight yarn and a 5.5 or I hook

Or

Adult (less for a smaller size) 1 1/2 oz/100gms of each colour of 8 ply yarn and a 4mm/G hook

Scissors and yarn needle

Abbreviations

sc = Single Crochet

hdc = Half Double Crochet

sl st= Slip stitch

tr=Treble (Triple)Crochet

yoh=Yarn over hook

rep=Repeat

pat=Pattern

rns(s) = Round(s)



Head Measurements

Crochet stretches so keep this in mind when making hats. If you make a hat ½ inch smaller than given measurements it will stretch to fit ©

0-3 months

Hat height = 5.5 to 6" Head Circumference 13" - 14"

3 to 6 months

Hat height= 6.5 - 7" Head Circumference: 14" - 17"

6 to 12 months

Hat height = 7.5" Head Circumference: 16" - 19"

12 months - 3 years

Hat height = 8" Head Circumference: 18" to 20"

3 - 10 years

Hat height =8.5" Head Circumference: 19" - 20 1/2"

Teenager

Hat height 9-10" Head Circumference: 20 1/2" - 22"

Adult Woman

Hat height 9-10" Head Circumference: 21.5" - 22.5"

Adult Man

Hat height 9-10" Head Circumference: 23" – 24"

Notes: Ch1 at beginning of rounds counts as 1SC throughout pattern Ch2 at beginning of rounds counts as HDC throughout pattern Ch4 at beginning of rounds counts as 1 TR throughout pattern

Stitch instructions

sc- insert hook in next st, yoh and pull up a loop (2 loops on hook), yoh and pull through all loops on hook - sc made

hdc- yoh and insert into next st, yoh and pull through loop (3 loops on hook), yoh and pull through all 3 loops. 1 hdc made

tr= yoh twice, then insert hook into next st, yoh and pull up a loop (4 loops on hook), yoh and pull through 2 loops (3 loops on hook), yoh and pull through last 2 loops on hook. 1 tr made



Mathematical formula to make your hat fit

Head circumference measurement divided by 3.14 = The measurement from 1 edge to the other. Keep increasing until you have that measurement

For example:

- 58cm divided by 3.14 = 18 cm (The answer is 18.4cm, you need to round down your answer to nearest whole number)
- Keep increasing the hat crown until it is 18cm
- The formula will also work for inches
- Chain 3 **DOES NOT** count as a stitch

Chain 4, join with a slip stitch into the 1st chain to make a ring

- 1. Chain 3, 12 dc into ring, join with a slip stitch into the 1st double crochet 12 stitches
- 2. Chain 3, 2 double crochets into the same stitch, 2 double crochets in each stitch around, join with a slip stitch into the 1st double crochet 24 stitches
- 3. Chain 3, 1 double crochet into the same stitch, 2 double crochets into the next stitch, *1 double crochet into the next stitch, 2 double crochets into the next stitch* repeat from * to * around , join with a slip stitch into the 1st double crochet 36 stitches

<u>If you are making an infant hat check your measurements for your hat to make sure you have made enough increase rounds</u>

4. Chain 3, 1 double crochet into the same stitch, 1 double crochet into the next stitch , 2 double crochets into the next stitch, *1 double crochet into the next 2 stitches, 2 double crochets into the next stitch* repeat from * to * around , join with a slip stitch into the 1st double crochet – 48 stitches

<u>Check your measurements for your hat to make sure you have made enough increase rounds</u>

- 5. Chain 3, 1 double crochet into the same stitch, 1 double crochet into the 2 next stitch , 2 double crochets into the next stitch, *1 double crochet into the next 3 stitches, 2 double crochets into the next stitch* repeat from * to * around , join with a slip stitch into the 1st double crochet 60 stitches
- 6. Chain 3, 1 double crochet into the same stitch, 1 double crochet into the 3 next stitch, 2 double crochets into the next stitch, *1 double crochet into the next 4 stitches, 2 double crochets into the



7. next stitch* repeat from * to * around , join with a slip stitch into the $1^{\rm st}$ double crochet – 62 stitches

If you need another increase round follow next row if not ignore the next row

8. Chain 3, 1 double crochet into the same stitch, 1 double crochet into the 4 next stitch , 2 double crochets into the next stitch, *1 double crochet into the next 5 stitches, 2 double crochets into the next stitch* repeat from * to * around , join with a slip stitch into the 1st double crochet – 74 stitches

Dimple pattern

For a more textured effect pop out the treble with your finger as you work your way along the row

- 1. Change colour: sc in same st as joining, tr in next st, *sc in next st, tr in next st* rpt from * to * to end, sl st to join in top of first sc.
- 2. Ch 4, 1 SC into the tr of last rnd,*1 tr into the sc of last rnd, 1 sc into into the tr of last rnd* rpt from *to*, sl st into top of ch4 to join.
- 3. Ch1, 1 tr into the sc of last rnd, *1 sc into the tr of last rnd, 1 tr into the sc of last rnd*, rpt from *to*, sl st in top of ch1 to join.

Repeat rounds 2 and 3 for the length of your hat. Remember to leave your hat a few rounds short so you can add the brim ©

Brim

Ch 2, 1 HDC in each st around, sl st in top of ch 2 to join. Repeat this round for length of hat.

Finish off and sew in any loose ends
