Hook 4.00mm. US G/6

Yarn 8 ply / US 4 ply

(Or yarn ply and hook size of your choice)

Tension not required



US terms used throughout pattern

St's used: ch= chain

dc= double crochet

sk = skip Shell st =4dc, ch 1, 4dc

 Special instructions: Pattern is made up with multiples - For 1 shell 25 ch +2, for additional shells add 15 example,

(25+15=40)40 +2 = 42 chains

(25+15+15=55) 55 + 2 = 57 chains

(25+15+15+15=70) 70 +2 72 chains

- Make your chain for as wide as you want your scarf or afghan.
- The ch 3 at the beginning of each row is the first dc of the row
- You will work your last st of every row into the top of the ch 3 which is referred to as a dc throughout pattern
- Shell =4dc, ch 1, 4dc in same space

To begin, make your ch

Row 1: work 1 dc in the 4th ch from hook, work 1 dc in the next 8 ch, *sk 2 ch, (4 dc, ch 1, 4dc) in the next ch (shell made), sk 2 ch, work 1 dc in the next 10 ch,* rep from *to* to end, ch 3 and turn

Row 2: work 9 dc in the next 9 dc, *sk 4 dc, work 1 shell in the ch 1 space of the shell, sk 4 dc, work 1 dc in the next 10 dc,* rep from *to* to end, ch 3 and turn

Row 3 and every other row worked, repeat row 2 for length desired, finish off and weave in ends
