Hook size 4.00 mm / G
Yarn, 8 ply/DK/Sports weight Yarn
OR
Medium worsted weight yarn and a 5.5mm / I
hook

US terms used throughout pattern
St's used:
SI st = slip stitch
Ch = chain
Sc= single crochet
Hdc= half double crochet

Mathematical formula to make your hat fit

Head circumference measurement divided by 3.14 = The measurement from 1 edge to the other. Keep increasing until you have that measurement

For example:

- 58cm divided by 3.14 = 18 cm (The answer is 18.4cm, you need to round down your answer to nearest whole number)
- Keep increasing the hat crown until it is 18cm
- The formula will also work for inches

Head Measurements

Crochet stretches so keep this in mind when making hats. If you make a hat $\frac{1}{2}$ inch smaller than given measurements it will stretch to fit •

0 to 3 months - Hat height = 5.5 to 6" Head Circumference 13" - 14"

3 to 6 months - Hat height= 6.5 - 7" Head Circumference: 14" - 17"

6 to 12 months - Hat height = 7.5" Head Circumference: 16" - 19"

12 months to 3 years - Hat height = 8" Head Circumference: 18" to 20"

3 -to 10 years - Hat height = 8.5" Head Circumference: 19" - 20 1/2"

Teenager Hat height – Hat height = 9-10" Head Circumference: 20 1/2" - 22"

Adult Woman - Hat height = 9-10" Head Circumference: 21.5" - 22.5"

Adult Man - Hat height = 9-10" Head Circumference: 23" – 24"

Beginning at top tail of the hat: ch 5, join with sl st to first ch to form a ring, ch 1

Round 1: work 6 hdc into the ring, do not join round

Round 2: work 1 hdc in each hdc around (6 hdc)

Repeat Round 2, for a length of approx 30 cm's (12 inches) long, or length desired. Upon completion count your st's, you should still have 6 hdc, if not adjust accordingly (increase or decrease)

Begin hat part: Use a stitch marker to keep track of your rounds, place stitch maker in last stitch of each round

Round 1: work 2 hdc's in each hdc around; do not join round, (12 hdc)

Round 2: *1 hdc into the next hdc, work 2 hdc into the next hdc* repeat from *to* to end of round, do not join round (18 hdc)

Round 3: *1 hdc into each of the next 2 hdc, work 2 hdc into the next hdc* repeat from *to* to end of round, do not join round (24 hdc)

Round 4: *1 hdc into each of the next 3 hdc, work 2 hdc into the next hdc* repeat from *to* to end of round, do not join round (30 hdc)

Round 5: *1 hdc into each of the next 4 hdc, work 2 hdc into the next hdc* repeat from *to* to end of round, do not join round (36 hdc) If you are making an infant hat check your measurements for your hat to make sure you have made enough increase rounds

Round 6: *1 hdc into each of the next 5 hdc, work 2 hdc into the next hdc* repeat from *to* to end of round, do not join round (42 hdc) **Check your measurements for your hat to make sure you have made enough increase rounds**

Round 7: *1 hdc into each of the next 6 hdc, work 2 hdc into the next hdc* repeat from *to* to end of round, do not join round (48 hdc)

Round 8: *1 hdc into each of the next 7 hdc, work 2 hdc into the next hdc* repeat from *to* to end of round, do not join round (54 hdc) **Check your measurements for your hat to make sure you have made enough increase rounds**

Round 9: *1 hdc into each of the next 8 hdc, work 2 hdc into the next hdc* repeat from *to* to end of round, do not join round (60 hdc)

Round 10: 1 hdc into each hdc to end of round, do not join round

Repeat Round 10 until you have your height

To finish - when round complete work 1 sc in next st, then sl st next2 st's. Attach a pompom for the final touch
