

# Crochet Eyelet Beanie with Brim Designed by Clare Sullivan Converted into written format by Laura

Materials:

100 gms 8ply yarn 4mm crochet hook

#### OR

3.5 oz Medium worsted weight yarn H/5mm hook Yarn Needle Scissors **US** stitches

SISt - Slip Stitch

Ch - Chain

Sc - Single Crochet

Dc - Double Crochet

SPECIAL STITCH: Hdc Dec - Half double crochet decrease: YO, go into st, pull up a loop (3 loops on hook), YO, go into next st, pull up a loop (5 loops on hook), YO and pull

through all 5 loops

### Mathematical formula to make your hat fit

Head circumference measurement divided by 3.14 = (Diameter) The measurement from 1 edge to the other. Keep increasing until you have that measurement For circumference and diameter see last page of pattern

#### For example:

58cm divided by 3.14 = 18 cm (The answer is 18.4cm, you need to round down your answer to nearest whole number)

Keep increasing the hat crown until it is 18cm

The formula will also work for inches

Sizing information is given at the end of the pattern



#### Hat

This pattern is using demonstrated using 8ply/Sport weight/DK/Worsted weight yarn For the 8ply a G (4.00mm) hook and for worsted a H (5.00mm) hook has been used. Starting with a magic circle, or ch5 and join to form a ring.

Rnd 1: Ch3 (counts as first Dc), 11 Dc into the centre of ring. Join to top of ch3.

Rnd 2: Ch3, dc into same st. Ch1, \*2dc, ch1, in next st. Repeat from \* around. Join to top of ch3.

Rnd 3: Ch3, 2dc in next st, ch1 skip ch 1, \*dc in next st, 2dc in next st, ch1, skip ch 1. Repeat from \* around. Join to top of ch3.

Rnd 4: Ch3, dc in next st, 2dc in next st, ch1, skip ch1. \*Dc in each of the next 2 sts, 2dc in next st, ch1, skip ch1. Repeat from \* around. Join to top of ch3.

If you are making an infant hat check your measurements for your hat to make sure you have made enough increase rounds. If your hat is big enough go to round 7

Rnd 5: Ch3, dc in each of the next 2 sts, 2dc in next st, ch1, skip ch1. \*Dc in each of the next 3 sts, 2dc in next st, ch1, skip ch1. Repeat from \* around. Join to top of ch3.

<u>Check your measurements for your hat to make sure you have made enough increase rounds.</u> . If your hat is big enough go to round 7

Rnd 6: Ch3, dc in each of the next 3 sts, 2dc in next st, ch1, skip ch1. \*Dc in each of the next 4 sts, 2dc in next st, ch1, skip ch1. Repeat from \* around. Join to top of ch3.

\*\*Repeat increase rounds for desired size of crown, always increasing as demonstrated above \*\*

Rnd 7: Ch3, dc in each dc st of previous rnd, ch1, skip ch1 space from previous rnd \*Dc in each dc, ch1, skip ch 1 space from previous rnd. Repeat from \* around. Join to top of ch3.

\*\*Repeat Rnd 7 until the beanie is your desired length down the head\*\*

**Note:** When I add a brim to a hat I generally make my hat 1 row shorter than what I would if I didn't add a brim

#### **Edging**

No brim- Repeat this round until you have the brim to desired length, finish off and sew in any loose ends

Rnd 1: chain 1, \*hdc into the dc's and hdc into the ch1 space \* repeat form \* to \* join with sl st to the ch 1



#### **Brim**

Yarn – same as used for hat – you will need 2 strands

Hook- same as used for hat

Lay your hat flat, as you can see with the image below if your yarn is still attached it needs to be on the top left 1  $\frac{1}{2}$  inches in from the edge. If you yarn is not attached you will need to attached it


Place a stitch marker on the top right 1  $\frac{1}{2}$  inches in from the edge (see image below) you will be working in between the attached yarn and the stitch marker

The image below was taken from another tutorial but the process of adding a brim is the same ©



The brim is worked with 2 strands of yarn and the same size hook that you use for 1 of the strands of yarn. The stitch marker is used as a GUIDE ONLY

- 1. Half double crochet into the first stitch, 1 half double crochet in the next stitch, \*2 half double crochet into the next stitch, 1 half double crochet into the next 2 stitches \* repeat across to stitch marker ending with 1 half double crochet into the next 2 stitches, slip stitch into the next 2 stitches, turn
- 2. Chain 1, skip next stitch and half double crochet in every stitch across, when you reach the end of the row you will half double crochet into the next available stitch 2 rows below (see image below)






- 3. Slip stitch in the next 2 stitches, turn
- 4. Skip first stitch and half double crochet into the next stitch, 1 half double crochet in the next stitch, \*2 half double crochet into the next stitch, 1 half double crochet into the next 2 stitches \* repeat across, when you reach the end of the row you will half double crochet into the next available stitch 2 rows below, slip stitch in the next 2 stitches, turn
- 5. Chain 1, skip next stitch and half double crochet in every stitch across, hdc into the next stitch 2 rows below, slip stitch into the next 2 stitches

**Optional** 

Slip stitch in each stitch around hat including brim Fasten off and sew in tails

# **Head Measurements**

Crochet stretches so keep this in mind when making hats. If you make a hat ½ inch smaller than given measurements it will stretch to fit ©

### 0-3 months

Hat height = 5.5 to 6" Head Circumference 13" - 14"

#### 3 to 6 months

Hat height= 6.5 - 7" Head Circumference: 14" - 17"

# 6 to 12 months

Hat height = 7.5" Head Circumference: 16" - 19"

# 12 months - 3 years

Hat height = 8" Head Circumference: 18" to 20"

# 3 - 10 years

Hat height =8.5" Head Circumference: 19" - 20 1/2"

### Teenager

Hat height 9-10" Head Circumference: 20 1/2" - 22"

# **Adult Woman**

Hat height 9-10" Head Circumference: 21.5" - 22.5"

### **Adult Man**

Hat height 9-10" Head Circumference: 23" – 24"
