

Hot water bottle cover

Worsted weight / 10 ply Red heart super saver 100 grams / 3.5 oz - blue 5.5 mm / 9 US hook 4.5 mm / 7.5 US hook Yarn needle Scissors

With 5.5 mm chain multiples of 4 NOTE: you want to make your chains about 1-2 cm SMALLER than the bottom of your hot water bottle (I did 24 chains)


Foundation row

- 1. Hdc into the 5th ch from the hook, hdc into the next 2 ch's, *ch 1, skip 1, 1 hdc into each of the next 3 ch's* repeat from * to * you will end on 1 hdc.
- 2. Ch 2, 2 hdc in the space on the end of row 1 (see pic) ch 1, 3 hdc, ch 1 into the same space

Working across the row (3 hdc, ch 1) into the next space (see pic)



(3 hdc, ch 1) into each space across, 3 x (3 hdc, ch 1) into the end space. Working down the other side of the foundation row, (3 hdc, ch 1) into each space across, (3 hdc, ch 1) into the end space. Join to the top of the ch 2. (Your end space will have 3 groups of (3 hdc, ch 1))

If you are changing colour for the next round, finish off If you are using the same colour for the next round – slip stitch across to the ch 1 space

- 4. (Ch 2, 2 hdc, ch 1) into space (3 hdc, ch 1) into each space around. Join to the top of the ch 2
- 5. Repeat round 3 until the length of the cover 1 1 % inches short of the neck if your bottle tapers at the top (see pic) you will want to stop there



With smaller hook

- Repeat round 3
- 3 hdc (NO CHAIN 1) into each space around. Join to the top of the ch 2
- Repeat last round until it comes up to the neck of the bottle

Neck

Sc into each stitch around Repeat last round until the neck is long enough

Tie

Chain as many as you need to make a tie Thread the chain through the last round of the granny stitch
