

Market Mesh Bag with 2 Handles
Designed by Clare Sullivan
Bag measure approximately 12 inch $\times 12$ inch not stretched - not including handle

Video tutorial -


Any yarn can be used for this bag, for my bag I used 4 ply worsted weight cotton and a 4.5 mm crochet hook
If you choose to use DK/8ply yarn you can use a 4 mm hook
Stitch marker
Yarn needle
Scissors
US terms used
Chain
Slip stitch
Half double crochet
Treble
Chain 5 counts as first treble crochet and chain 1
For the main section of the bag we do not work into the chain 1 until we get to the edging and handles

## Bag

## Round 1

Make a magic ring, chain 5 (chain 4 counts as first treble crochet and $5^{\text {th }}$ chain counts as chain 1) working into the magic ring, treble and chain 1 until you have 20 trebles and chain 1 spaces (remembering the chain 5 counts as you $1^{\text {st }}$ stitch and chain 1) slip stitch to the $4^{\text {th }}$ chain to join

## Round 2

Note - Do not crochet into the chain 1, we are only crocheting into the treble stitch
Chain 5, treble and chain 1 into the same stitch, * (treble, chain 1, treble, chain 1) into the next stitch* repeat from * to * slip stitch to the 4th chain to join

## Round 3

Chain 5, (treble, chain 1, treble, chain 1) into the next stitch, *treble, chain 1 into the next stitch, (treble, chain 1 , treble, chain 1) into the next stitch* repeat from * to * slip stitch to the 4th chain to join

## Round 4 (optional)

If you would like to make your bag larger you can add another increase round as follows
Chain 5, treble and chain 1 in the next stitch, (treble chain 1, treble chain 1) into the next stitch * treble and chain 1 in the next stitch, treble and chain 1 into the next stitch, (treble chain 1 , treble chain 1 ) into the next stitch* repeat from * to * slip stitch to the $4^{\text {th }}$ chain to join

Round 4 (round 5 if you added the extra increase)
Chain 5 , treble and chain 1 into each stitch, repeat around remembering we do not work into the chain 1 . Slip stitch to the $4^{\text {th }}$ chain to join

Repeat round 4 (round 5 if you added the extra increase) until desired length, remembering the bag will stretch when filled with your shopping ©
From the beginning I did a total of 12 rows

The chain 1 space now counts as a stitch $\odot$
Edging

- Chain 1, half double crochet into the chain 1 space, * half double crochet in to the treble (from previous row), half double crochet into the chain 1 space* repeat from * to * Slip stitch to the $1^{\text {st }}$ chain to join
- Chain 1, half double crochet into each stitch around. Slip stitch to the first half double crochet to join
You can repeat this row as many times as you like DO NOT FINISH OFF


Lay bag flat with beginning of row about $1 / 4$ of the way from the edge - place the beginning of the row where the red stitch is


Fold top of bag in half so edges are together


Then fold in half again



Place a stitch marker in all 4 layers on the fold


Unfold


- Make a chain (I did 70) and join with a slip stitch into the next marked stitch, finish off, don't worry about sewing in the end as you can crochet over it on the next round
- Flip bag over and join yarn into the stitch marker in the right hand side, chain (I did 70) join into next stitch marker
- Chain 1, single crochet into each stitch around until chains, work 1 single crochet into each chain on handle, single crochet in each stitch around until you get to next handle, single crochet into each chain on handle and single crochet round until beginning of round, slip stitch to join into first single crochet
- Chain 1, single crochet into each stitch all around the bag and handles


## Optional

If you want to make the sides of your bag gather in a little, work another row around except when you get to the sides, single crochet decrease in each stitch on the sides

Sew in any loose ends
