3.5oz / 100 gms Worsted weight yarn and a 5mm/ H hook OR
3.5oz / 100 gms 8ply / DK / Sports weight yarn and a 4mm / G hook Scissors
Yarn needle

Stitches used Chain Single crochet Double crochet



Mathematical formula to make your hat fit

Head circumference / thickest part of hair if you have dreads measurement divided by 3.14 = The measurement from 1 edge to the other. Keep increasing until you have that measurement

For example:

58cm divided by 3.14 = 18 cm (The answer is 18.4cm, you need to round down your answer to nearest whole number)

Keep increasing the hat crown until it is 18cm

The formula will also work for inches

Head Measurements

Crochet stretches so keep this in mind when making hats. If you make a hat ½ inch smaller than given measurements it will stretch to fit ©

0-3 months

Hat height = 5.5 to 6" Head Circumference 13" - 14"

3 to 6 months

Hat height= 6.5 - 7" Head Circumference: 14" - 17"

6 to 12 months

Hat height = 7.5" Head Circumference: 16" - 19"

12 months - 3 years

Hat height = 8" Head Circumference: 18" to 20"

3 - 10 years

Hat height =8.5" Head Circumference: 19" - 20 1/2"

Teenager

Hat height 9-10" Head Circumference: 20 1/2" - 22"

Adult Woman

Hat height 9-10" Head Circumference: 21.5" - 22.5"

Adult Man

Hat height 9-10" Head Circumference: 23" - 24"

- The beginning chain 4 of each row will count as first double crochet and a chain 1
- We will only be working into the double crochet from the previous row and not the chain 1




Make a magic ring or chain 4 and slip stitch to first chain to join.

- 1. Chain 4 (count as first double crochet and a chain 1) *double crochet into the ring, chain 1* repeat from * to * until you have 10 double crochets and 10 chain 1, join to the 3rd chain of the beginning chain 4 with a slip stitch
- 2. Chain 4, double crochet, chain 1 into same stitch as the chain 4. *double crochet, chain 1, double crochet, chain 1 into the next double crochet* repeat from * to * around and join to the 3rd chain of the beginning chain 4 with a slip stitch
- 3. Chain 4, (double crochet, chain 1, double crochet, chain 1) into the next stitch *1 double crochet, chain 1 into the next stitch, (1 double crochet, chain 1, 1 double crochet, chain 1) into the next stitch* repeat from * to * around and join to the 3rd chain of the beginning chain 4 with a slip stitch. Do not forget to measure your hat ©


If at any stage you get to your correct measurement, skip to round 6

- 4. Chain 4, double crochet, chain 1 into the next stitch, (double crochet, chain 1, double crochet, chain 1) into the next stitch *1 double crochet, chain 1 into the next 2 stitches, (double crochet, chain 1, double crochet, chain 1) into the next stitch* repeat from * to * around and join to the 3rd chain of the beginning chain 4 with a slip stitch. Do not forget to measure your hat ☺
- 5. Chain 4, double crochet, chain 1 into the next 2 double crochets, (double crochet, chain 1, double crochet, chain 1) into the next double crochet. *double crochet, chain 1 into the next 3 double crochets (1 double crochet, chain 1, double crochet chain 1) into the next double crochet* repeat from * to * around and join to the 3rd chain of the beginning chain 4 with a slip stitch. Do not forget to measure your hat ©
- 6. Chain 4, *double crochet, chain 1 into the next double crochet* repeat from * to * around and join to the 3rd chain of the beginning chain 4 with a slip stitch
- 7. Repeat row 6 until you reach 2 rows **shorter** than your desired hat length. Finish off, sew on ends. If you have dreads you will make you hat long enough to go over your hair
- Make a chain twice the length of your head circumference, (this will be the length of one of your straps, you can do less or more chains if you like) join the chain with a slip stitch to any of the double crochet on the last row of the hat (See next image) Finish off
- Count across 9 stitches (or the amount you want to leave at the back) join yarn (see number 2 below) make a chain the same length as the 1st chain you just made, single crochet into the 2nd chain form the hook and each chain across





Single crochet into the double crochet and chain 1 space around (see below) we are not
crocheting into the smaller gap between the chains. Single crochet into the chains to complete the
other strap, turn



- Chain 1, single crochet into each stitch across strap and around hat and the other strap, turn
- Repeat previous row until your strap is about 1 inch wide
- Finish off and sew in ends,
