Note: You can use any yarn you like, make sure you use the recommended hook

8ply/DK/Sports weight yarn with 4mm / G Crochet Hook $\ensuremath{\mathsf{OR}}$

Worsted weight/10ply yarn with a 5.5 mm / I Crochet Hook Scissors and darning needle

US Terms

Ch - Chain

DC - Double Crochet

St(s) - Stitch(s)

Make a slip knot. Ch4, 2dc in 4th ch from hook. (3dc sts) Ch3, turn

Row 1: 2dc in same st as ch3, 1dc in next st, 3dc in last st. Ch3 turn. (7dc sts)

Row 2: 2dc in same st as ch3, 1dc in next 5 sts, 3dc in last st. Ch3 turn. (11dc sts)

Row 3: 2dc in same st as ch3, 1dc in next 9 sts, 3dc in last st. Ch3 turn. (15dc sts)

Row 3: 2dc in same st as ch3, 1dc in next 13 sts, 3dc in last st. Ch3 turn. (19dc sts)

Carry on increasing 3dc at the beginning and end of each row and 1dc in between until you reach your desire size.

When you've finished getting to the size you wish, fasten off yarn and sew in yarn tails. You can also add a fringe border.

CROCHET SINGLE CROCHET BORDER

Insert your hook into the bottom 2sts where you started your shawl. Pull yarn through and secure with a slip stitch.

Start by working your single crochet on the top edges. You have to decide where to put the sts and sometimes it might curl up and that means you've not added enough single crochet stitches, which might make it a bit tight. It needs to look flat when laid down. Don't work into the gaps or you'll end up with a gaping hole. Work single crochet to the end.

When you reach top row edge, work 3sc in corner st, which will make it go around the corner, otherwise it will curl up. 1sc in each st across row. 3sc into corner stitch.

Work across the other side. When you get to the last st which will the beginning, slip stitch into first stitch and fasten off. You can add as many single crochet rows as you desire

Finish off and sew in ends
