## Wedding Shaw

US terminology


150 grams (1 $1 / 2$ balls) Red heart shimmer $5 \mathrm{~mm} / \mathrm{H}$ hook
Yarn needle and scissors

## NOTES:

- When it has instructions in brackets and then a $x 3$ (could be any number) after it it means that you need to repeat the instructions in brackets that many times...for example if it is x3-you do the instructions in brackets (that counts as once) and then do the instructions in brackets 2 more times
- Motifs are all worked on 1 strip - no joining YAY !!

Make a chain as wide as you want your shawl - you can undo any extra chains (I did 160 chains)

1. Dc into the $5^{\text {th }} \mathrm{ch}$, ch 1 , (dc, ch 1) $x 3$ in the same ch, skip 3 ch's, slip stitch into the next ch * ch 1 , skip 3 , (dc,ch1) x4 into the next ch. Skip 3 ch , slip stitch into the next ch * repeat from * to * across. (dc, ch1) x7 into last ch

## Working down other side of ch

Skip 3 ch. Slip stitch into next ch (same ch as you slipped into on the other side) repeat from * to * across. Into last ch (where we worked all of our dc, ch1's) ch 1 ( $\mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 1$ ) x 2 , slip stitch to the $3^{\text {rd }}$ ch from beginning to join
2. Slip stitch to the ch 1 space *(ch 3,3 dc, ch 3 , slip stitch) into the ch 1 space, slip stitch into the dc and ch 1 space* repeat from * to * into the next 3 ch 1 spaces. You will have 4 petals
Slip stitch into the following - (dc, 2 ch 1 spaces, dc and ch 1 space)
${ }^{* *}$ (ch $3,3 \mathrm{dc}$, ch 3 , slip stitch) into the ch 1 space, slip stitch into the dc and ch 1 space** repeat from ${ }^{* *}$ to ${ }^{* *}$ into the next 2 ch 1 spaces. You will have 3 petals. Slip stitch into the following - (dc, 2 ch 1 spaces, dc and ch 1 space) ${ }^{* * *}$ repeat from * to ${ }^{* * *}$ across
When you get to the end flower you will work 6 petals and continue in pattern across to end

## Body of shawl

Laying your strip of flowers horizontally - looking at the flower on the right hand side, you can see it has 6 petals - 3 on one side (let's call this the top) and 3 on the other (let's call this the bottom) Join yarn into the first ch 3 of the $4^{\text {th }}$ petal (start counting petals from the bottom)

1. Ch 6 ( $\mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 2$ ) into top of last ch 3 of the same petal, (dc ch2) into the top of the first ch 3 of the next petal, (dc, ch 2 ) into top of last ch 3 of the same petal, (dc ch2) into the top of the first ch 3 of the next petal *(dc, ch 2) into top of last ch 3 of the next petal, (dc ch2) into the top of the first ch 3 of the next petal, (dc, ch 2 ) into top of last ch3 of the same petal, (dc ch2) into the top of the first ch 3 of the next petal* repeat from * to * across

* (dc, ch 2) into the last ch3 of the next petal (dc, ch2) into top of first ch3 of the next petal (dc, ch2) into the top of the last ch 3 of the same petal, (dc, ch2) into top of first ch3 of the next petal* repeat from * to * across ch 2 , tr into top of the last ch 3 of the same petal

2. Ch 4, turn *skip ch 2 space (tr, ch 2 , tr) into next ch 2 space* repeat from * to * across. Tr into the last ch space (this is the ch 6 space from row 1 of the body of shawl)
3. Ch 4, turn *(tr, ch 2, tr) into next ch 2 space* repeat from * to * across. Tr into top of ch 4 from previous row
4. Repeat row 3 for majority of the body of shawl - I did 14 rows

Neck

1. Ch $3^{*}(\mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 2, \mathrm{dc})$ into next ch 2 space* repeat from * to * across. dc into top of ch 4 from previous row
2. Ch 3 * (dc, ch $2, \mathrm{dc}$ ) into next ch 2 space* repeat from * to * across. dc into top of ch 3 from previous row
3. Repeat row 2
4. Ch 1 , sc into same stitch, sc into the next stitch, 2 sc into the chain 2 space, ${ }^{*}$ sc into the next 2 stitches, 2 sc into the ch 2 space*
